#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT - MARILYN C. JONES, M.D.

I hope you have already made plans to attend the 2005 Carmel meetings. The theme for this year's Joint Plenary Session (Thursday, February 3, 2005 in the Pacific Repertory Theater-Golden Bough) is "The Many Faces of Nitric Oxide". 1998 Nobel laureate, Ferid Murad, University of Texas Health Sciences Center, will give the WAP Distinguished Lecture, "Nitric oxide and cyclic GMP in cell signaling and drug development" as part of this symposium. John Kinsella, University of Colorado, will deliver the Stanley Wright lecture on "Nitric oxide in the treatment of neonatal respiratory distress and pulmonary hypertension". Mark Gladwin, NIH, will address the "Role of nitric oxide in the pathogenesis and therapy of sickle cell disease". Ron Swerdloff, Harbor/UCLA will speak on "The many positive effects of NO on reproduction". John Cooke, Stanford, will focus on "Nitric oxide and angiogenesis".

In addition to the theme speakers, the WSPR presents its awards in the Thursday plenary. The Ross Young Investigator award begins the morning session at 8:30 followed by the Joseph W. St. Gene, Jr. Award in Education. The David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Award and the Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award, both presented abstracts, begin the afternoon sessions at 1:45pm. The membership is encouraged to support our awardees with their presence. We anticipate two stimulating sessions.

The Western Association of Physicians has revitalized its Wednesday afternoon symposium, which will focus on "The Impact of '-Omics' on Modern Medicine". Speakers include David Cox on genomics, James Paulson on glycomics, and Harvey Cohen on proteomics. I encourage all WSPR members to make travel plans that allow them to attend this outstanding program (3:30-5:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 2, 2005).

The Nominations Committee is soliciting input from the membership regarding nominations for council membership.
