The planning for our 2007 meeting is complete, and we look forward to seeing many of you in Carmel, hopefully in the company of young trainees and students attracted to our meeting for the first time.

As a reminder, Early Bird registration (before January 24th) represents significant savings over the onsite registration fees. All members and non-members should complete their documentation in Carmel and the desks will be open in the Sunset Centre lobby beginning on January 31st from 1:00-5:00 pm. On that day, student and resident registration will also be possible at the Monterey Beach Hotel at the Captain's Table Room between 3:00-5:00 pm.

I would encourage you and your trainees to attend the first session of our five society meeting which will be held in the Carpenter Hall of the Sunset Center between 2:30-5:00 pm on Wednesday January 31st from 1:00-5:00 pm in Carmel. This session is sponsored by WAP, and the topic is "The Interplay of Oxidative Stress, Inflammation, Dyslipidemia and Hypertension in the Pathogenesis of Cardiovascular Disease". As is our tradition, a Welcoming Intersociety Cocktail Reception will follow from 5:30-7:00 pm across the street at the Carmel Women's Club.

This year the Joint Plenary Session of Societies (WAFMR, WSCI, WAP, and WSPR) have a global health focus. The first Plenary Session begins with WSPR Ross Young Investigative Research lecture, and in addition, WSPR will present the Joseph St. Geme Jr. award.

In the afternoon session the WSPR Stanley Wright Memorial Lecture will be given by Dr. Jane Schaller who will present "Global Child Health: Training for International Health Initiatives". This session will also include the WSPR David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Award and the Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award with presentations by the awardees. I hope you will encourage the trainees coming with you to support these events and our acknowledgement of the work done by the award winners. The list of the State-or-the-Art presentations is attached to this newsletter and with the Joint Plenary Session the State-of-the-Art lectures continue to be highlight of the Carmel meeting, and event which I would once again encourage you to make your trainees aware of.
