This excellent series of presentations will begin with our WSPR Stanley Wright Memorial Lecture "The Risk of Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease in Children and Adolescents" delivered by Dr. Stephen Daniels, Professor and Chair of Pediatrics at the University of Colorado School of Medicine. During the day, the WSPR Joseph W. St. Geme, Jr. Education Award, the WSPR Young Investigator Research Award, the WSPR David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Research Award and the WSPR Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award will be presented. Please plan to attend with your trainees to support and appreciate the fine work of our society colleagues. Of course, the specialty sessions on Friday and Saturday will be filled with the results of a banner year for abstract submissions and will again feature 17 outstanding "State-of-the-Art" presentations. Business Meeting immediately following the afternoon Plenary Session at approximately 4:15 pm at the Pacific Repertory Theater.
