MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT William Hay, MD

Greetings from the University of Colorado!

I am delighted and honored to serve the Western Society for Pediatric Research as this year's President and to help the WSPR carry on its traditions of providing our members with an excellent meeting in Carmel and to continue our close collaborations with our colleagues in Adult Medicine and the Medical Student Research organizations. The WSPR has been an important part of so many of our careers, especially as trainees and junior faculty members. The WSPR has been a treasured part of my academic life since fellowship and a place to meet and get to know others who have become career long colleagues. I have missed only two meetings since 1978, both during sabbaticals. Many of you have had similar experiences and it has been your collective efforts to attend the meeting, review and present abstracts, give talks, and meet trainees and junior faculty and welcome them into the society that have kept the meeting strong and so appealing. Added to your efforts are the unique abstract presentation venues here and there in Carmel, surrounded by the Monterey Bay and Peninsula area, all of which have made this society the wonderful treasure that it is. We are indebted to you for keeping the future of the WSPR alive - by recruiting new members and encouraging our junior colleagues and trainees to develop their own sense of affection and gratitude for the WSPR.

My predecessor, De-Ann Pillers, and our current (but retiring from this post after this year's meeting) Secretary-Treasurer, Robin Ohls, have left the WSPR in good fiscal health and membership stability. I am encouraged that despite the competition for our limited time and resources, all of the Pediatric Research regional societies continue to thrive, especially the WSPR. As De-Ann noted last year, we all believe the health of the WSPR is a continuing testament to our special opportunity to meet together in the charming town of Carmel-by-the-Sea in the beautiful Carmel Valley, surrounded by the ever-challenging Pebble Beach Golf Course, the tourist attractions of Monterey (including the touristy Monterey Warf and especially the Monterey Aguarium), and the magnificent Big Sur sea coast. What a wonderful setting for nurturing the emerging careers of young investigators. Many a collegial friendship has been struck or fostered on a rocky point at Point Lobos surrounded by some of the most spectacular scenery in the world and some of the most fascinating aquatic life on US sea coasts, as well as in the meetings where our abstract presentations are generally greeted by warm applause and cheers more than tough critiques (although there has been no shortage of insightful questions to keep the scientific level high!).

Our 2011 annual meeting, Wednesday January 26th through Saturday January 29th, will continue the highly successful format of a joint plenary session co-sponsored by the four principal participating organizations, i.e. the Western Society for Pediatric Research, the Western Society for Clinical Investigation, the Western Association of Physicians, and the Western Section of the American Federation for Medical Research. The theme for the overall meeting will be to focus on novel insights in "Global Health".

The main WSPR component of the plenary session, the Stanley Wright Memorial Lecture, will be delivered by Dr. Nancy Krebs from the University of Colorado, and is entitled "Global Nutrition: Evidence of Progress, Persistence of Challenges." The plenary session will be held in the Pacific Repertory Theater--Golden Bough on Thursday, January 27, 2011.

The specialty sessions on Friday and Saturday will feature more than 20 excellent "State-of-the-Art" presentations covering a broad array of topics. Continuing this year

will be the Joan Hodgman Neonatology State of the Art presentation, dedicated to the memory of our long-time WSPR friend and colleague, Dr. Joan Hodgman of USC. This year's Hodgman presentation will be given by Susan Niermeyer MD (University of Colorado) on the topic "Helping Babies Breathe", the new AAP initiative to train birth attendants in resource-limited settings in neonatal resuscitation. Sue and her colleagues are working hard to stimulate innovative and informative research around this global educational program.

It is my pleasure to thank my fellow officers, President-Elect David Gremse (University of Utah), Past-President De-Ann Pillers (Wisconsin), and particularly Secretary-Treasurer Robin Ohls (New Mexico), and also the Council members Heidi Feldman, Colin White, and Cris Cunniff) for their continued service and dedication to the WSPR. Finally, special thanks to Dr. Ohls' administrative assistants, Green Carlson, Erin Austin, and Annie Chavez, for keeping us all on task and holding the organization together!

Start planning for the 2011 WSPR annual meeting in Carmel, and take a moment to think about how you can contribute to the society in the process: energize your department chairs and division heads, recruit new members, and nominate your colleagues and trainees for the yearly WSPR Research Awards. Most importantly, encourage your medical students, residents, fellows, and faculty colleagues to submit their best work for presentation (abstract deadline is Friday, October 1st) and then be sure to attend. We are looking forward to seeing you in beautiful Carmel!

Joseph St. Geme Education Award: *Deadline October 1, 2010*This award is conferred biannually by the WSPR in recognition of outstanding achievement in Pediatric Education. The award is presented to the winner at a plenary session of the meeting and is accompanied by a \$1,250 award and a plaque provided by Abbott Nutrition.

Abbott Nutrition Award in Research by a Young Investigator: *Deadline October 1, 2010*

The WSPR confers this award on a chosen nominee in recognition of outstanding research in a field related to pediatrics. The nominee must have a junior faculty (Assistant Professor, Instructor) academic appointment. There is no age restriction. The work need not have been published. Abbott Nutrition will provide \$1,250 and a suitably engraved plague to be presented to the awardee at the annual meeting. The award winner will be asked to present some aspects of his/her work, or a summary of it, at one of the two combined plenary sessions. Nominations may be tendered by an active or Emeritus member of the WSPR. Electronically submitted nominations are the preferred mode of submission. Nominations should be in the form of a narrative letter which includes a clear statement of the reasons for nomination of the candidate. Nominations should also include a copy of the nominee's CV, and copies of reprints, preprints, or other documents, if considered applicable. The award may be given to more than one nominee at the discretion of the Committee, or it may be omitted if the Committee considers that an outstanding candidate has not been nominated. Completed electronic nominations are preferred, and can be sent via e-mail to WSPR@salud.unm.edu.

David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Research Award: Deadline October 1, 2010 This award is sponsored by Abbott Nutrition Laboratories and will be accompanied by a plaque and a \$1000 honorarium. The recipient will present his/her paper at one of the subspecialty sessions of the WSPR. The award is based upon an abstract submitted for presentation at the annual meeting. The criteria for this award include: original, unpublished research by a Pediatric Resident or Fellow, under the auspices of a WSPR member or in a WSPR-affiliated program, during house staff training or within the first three years of the applicant's pediatric fellowship training program. The award is given during or within one year following the above-described period of training.

Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award:

This award is given to the student submitting the most outstanding abstract to this year's WSPR meeting. The research may be in any area of pediatrics. Abbott Nutrition Laboratories is sponsoring this award, which includes a generous \$750 honorarium. The student will be asked to present the abstract at a subspecialty session. This award will be presented to the top scoring abstract submitted by a student to WSPR. No nomination materials are required.

Mead Johnson Travel Awards:

A generous gift amount for travel money will be available for travel awards for the 2011 meeting, and is provided by a grant from Mead Johnson Nutrition. The purpose of these awards is to facilitate participation in the WSPR by those least able to afford the meeting (i.e., medical students, residents and fellows).

Abstracts will be selected by the WSPR officers on the basis of merit and ranking by subspecialty reviewers. Specific letters of nomination from mentors are helpful, but not required. We will give as many awards as funding allows.
