MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Greetings from Vancouver!

As I sit down to write this letter I can't help but remind everyone that it has been 59 YEARS + since the first WSPR meeting in 1953! Yes this years meeting will be our 60th Anniversary - an auspicious one for us and the Queen of England!

You will see many changes, and some challenges, for this meeting and the WSPR, highlighted throughout this newsletter. What you won't see is any loss of energy or commitment from your elected representatives and council members. I can promise every one of you that we, the Council, remain committed to upholding the goals of our society and fostering the best academic and scientific meeting on the West Coast for Pediatric Students, Fellows and Junior Attendings.

As always we will present many prestigious awards to students, residents, fellows and junior faculty, all supported by **Abbott Nutrition**; and I highly encourage ALL of you to careful look at the students and faculty whose work is deserving of consideration for one of these awards [see section in newsletter].

We will also provide many travel grants due to the generous support of **Mead Johnson Nutrition** - if YOU know of deserving students, residents or fellows who would be interested in presenting their work but might have difficulty financially attending the meeting <u>please let us know</u>.

The Stanley Wright Memorial Lectureship will be given this year during the Friday AM plenary session by Dr. Allison Eddy, former head of the Division of Pediatric Nephrology at Seattle Children's and now Professor of Pediatrics and the Head of the Department of Pediatrics and a member of the Nephrology Division at BC Children's

Hospital in Vancouver. Dr. Eddy will talk on <u>Inflammation in Chronic Disease</u>, an area she is a recognized expert on. She is a great speaker and I encourage you all to come and here her speak on this important topic.

None of the success of the meeting would happen without the efforts of everyone on the Council and a number of others you don't often see or hear of. In particular I would like to thank Dave Viskochil and his assistant in Utah, Tammy Sheffield, who work tirelessly to keep our Society running behind the scenes. Bill's insights, experience and thoughtful comments have all been welcome to the executive and myself over the last months.

- 2. Please let Dave and I know what <u>you</u> value the WSPR meetings for or perhaps more importantly let us know what brings you back to this meeting year after year [or if you no longer come why did you stop was it something 'we said']. Seriously, the WSPR needs to be a society with an active membership if we are to survive and pass along our values and belief in the need for Pediatric Academics and Scientists pursuing children's health issues as being vital to the children we care for! And to do this properly, we as a Council need to understand what our member's want/need from our organization and this meeting.
- 3. Plan to talk about the CARMEL MEETING to at least 2 young colleagues at your institution in the next 2 weeks! Maybe they are residents, or fellows perhaps they are junior staff or a post-doc in the lab across the hall. No matter who they are if they do work that the WSPR would value then they should come to Carmel and be recognized for their efforts on behalf of children's health! - 4. Next <u>Click here</u> and please pay your dues for 2012-13. The 2013 Abbott Nutrition Awards will be presented during the plenary session. The awards include the Abbott Nutrition Award in Research by a Young Investigator, the David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Research Award, and the Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award. Information is included below for instructions on nominating deserving faculty and trainees.

Abbott Nutrition Young Investigator Award in Research: Deadline Oct 10, 2012 The WSPR confers this award on a chosen nominee in recognition of outstanding research in a field related to pediatrics. The nominee must have a junior faculty (Assistant Professor, Instructor) academic appointment. There is no age restriction. The work need not have been published. Abbott Nutrition will provide \$1,250 and a suitably engraved plaque to be presented to the awardee at the annual meeting. The award winner will be asked to present some aspects of his/her work, or a summary of it, at one of the two combined plenary sessions. Nominations may be tendered by an active or Emeritus member of the WSPR. Electronically submitted nominations are the preferred mode of submission. Nominations should be in the form of a narrative letter which includes a clear statement of the reasons for nomination of the candidate. Nominations should also include a copy of the nominee's CV, and copies of reprints, preprints, or other documents, if considered applicable. The award may be given to more than one nominee at the discretion of the Committee, or it may be omitted if the Committee considers that an outstanding candidate has not been nominated. David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Research Award: Deadline October 3, 2012
This award is sponsored by Abbott Nutrition Laboratories and will be accompanied by a plaque and a \$1000 honorarium. The recipient will present his/her paper at one of the subspecialty sessions of the WSPR. The award is based upon an abstract submitted for presentation at the annual meeting. The criteria for this award include: original, unpublished research by a Pediatric Resident or Fellow, under the auspices of a WSPR member or in a WSPR-affiliated program, during house staff training or within the first three years of the applicant's pediatric fellowship training program. The award is given during or within one year following the above-described period of training.

Nominations may be submitted by any active or Emeritus member of the Society. The application should be in the form of a narrative letter describing the work, its significance, the background of the nominee and an assurance (signature) that the nominee will be available to present the work. A copy of the abstract <u>must</u> accompany the letter. A CV of the nominee and any supporting documents, research summaries, etc., may accompany the packet, but is not a prerequisite for nomination. Again, the preferred mode of submission is in electronic format. Completed

Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award:

This award is given to the student submitting the most outstanding abstract to this year's WSPR meeting. The research may be in any area of pediatrics. Abbott Nutrition Laboratories is sponsoring this award, which includes a generous \$750 honorarium. The student will be asked to present the abstract at a subspecialty session. This award will be presented to the top scoring abstract submitted by a student to WSPR. No nomination materials are required.

Mead Johnson Travel Awards:

A generous gift amount for travel money will be available for travel awards for the 2013 meeting, and is provided by a grant from Mead Johnson Nutrition. The purpose of these awards is to facilitate participation in the WSPR by those least able to afford the meeting (i.e., medical students, residents and fellows).

Abstracts will be selected by the WSPR officers on the basis of merit and ranking by subspecialty reviewers. Specific letters of nomination from mentors are helpful, but not required. We will give as many awards as funding allows.

Parting Notes

This has been a transition year as our joint societies combine to decrease expenses of the meeting rather than increase revenues (meaning increased registration fess or abstract costs). This has been accomplished by decreasing the number of oral presentations, reducing 3 plenary sessions to 1, renegotiating the A-V contract, restricting the sessions to the Sunset Center, not providing CME credits, and combining medical student activities with the whole meeting. These actions have reduced expenses significantly. We are retaining state of the art speakers and all the awards, thanks to contributions from Meade Johnson and Abbott Labs. This year we have initiated coverage of registration fees for the moderators of each oral session. We have also invited the Western Society for Pediatric Nephrology to join our meeting, and we will be looking for other subspecialty pediatric societies to consider coordinating their annual meetings with the WSPR meeting in Carmel.

You are again encouraged to arrive in Carmel early Thursday, January 24th [or even on the Wednesday], as the opening sessions begin at 1pm and the Welcome reception, including a poster session and the Abbott Labs Reception, will be Thursday evening.
