In keeping with this theme, it is my pleasure to welcome long time WSPR member **Robert Lane** as **the 2014 Stanley Wright Speaker**. Dr. Lane is former Division chief of Neonatology at The University of Utah, now Professor and Chair of the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. His lifelong commitment to research involving the 'personalized medicine' of Epigenetics will provide the perfect start to a Friday morning of outstanding presentations in the main Theater of the Sunset Center. The final schedule for the 2014 meeting will be provided in a later newsletter, and will closely follow last year's schedule of sessions held at the Sunset Center.

The WSPR Abbott Nutrition Young Investigator Award: This award is conferred every year to an outstanding Pediatric Scientist in the early phase (Assistant Professor) of their career. The David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Research Award: This award is conferred every year to an outstanding Pediatric Scientist in the training phase (resident or fellow) of their career. Past awardees include Steven Abman, William Benitz, Christine Burren and Con Yost. Nominees are expected to submit an abstract to WSPR and present their work during the plenary session.

The Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award: This award is given to the student with the most outstanding abstract submitted to WPSR. A copy of the student's abstract must accompany the nomination letter. Past awardees include Richard Kelly, Ken Liechty, David A. Stevenson (aka, Stevenson the Younger) and Mary Crisham Janik.
