Dear WSPR Members:

Summer, soon-to-be-fall, greetings to our WSPR family, and welcome to our new members! I am honored to serve as this year's President of the Western Society for Pediatric Research and ramp-up enthusiasm for next year's meeting in Carmel.

We have three important reminders for you right off the bat. The first reminder is to think about nominees from your institution for the various awards that WSPR offers. Please take time to nominate your colleagues, especially trainees and young investigators! To help you, the list of WSPR awards is provided below. The list also identifies the awardees from the last Carmel meeting. Congratulations to them once again!

The second reminder is to nominate colleagues for membership to the WSPR, both full membership and trainee membership. One of the ways to sustain our vibrant society is to recruit new members. There is a simple application process through the WSPR Council followed by voting from the WSPR membership. Remember that there are no geographic restrictions to membership, and that PhDs are also eligible. New members will be assessed dues on a prorated basis depending on when they become official members. **Note: Trainee members do not automatically progress to regular members, as they must go through an official nomination process.**

The deadline for nominations is **January 15, 2015**, although nominations are accepted any time of the year. Forms for full membership and trainee membership nominations along with more information on membership nomination criteria are located on the WSPR website at:

The third reminder is that the submission deadline for abstracts is October 1, 2014 (by 12:00 midnight PST). Now is a good time to organize data and draft abstracts. The URL for abstract submission is:

The upcoming meeting is January 29-31, 2015. The meeting will have the combined societies of the WSPR, WSCI, WAP, WSAFMR, and WSMRF. The combined societies once again worked to have a theme at the 2015 meeting. The combined societies selected obesity as the meeting's theme. This theme is selected to complement last year's theme of personalized medicine and technology. The WSPR succeeded in having Suzanne B Cassidy, MD, FAAP, FACMG, Clinical Professor of Pediatrics, Division of Medical Genetics, UCSF be the **Stanley Wright Lecturer**. Dr. Cassidy's lecture will be part of the Plenary Session on Friday, January 30, 2015, in the main Theater of the Sunset Center. Her topic will be Prader-Willi Syndrome in the context of obesity, genetics, embryology, and development. We are thrilled and fortunate to have Dr. Cassidy's expertise on this topic to challenge our minds about the problems associated with obesity. We hope that your participation will bring an abundance of outstanding nominees from a wide variety of institutions throughout the West! Please consider nominating your deserving colleagues and trainees. Brief descriptions of the awards are:

The WSPR Abbott Nutrition Young Investigator Award: This award is conferred every year to an outstanding Pediatric Scientist in the early phase (Assistant Professor) of their career. Past recipients include Philip Sunshine, Kurt Stenmark, Alan Jobe, and last year's Stanley Wright Speaker, Robert Lane. Please share your brightest new Pediatric Researchers with WSPR! (\$1,200 plus 2 nights accommodations; nomination required; abstract submission not required.)

The David W. Smith Pediatric Trainee Research Award (Abbott): This award is conferred every year to an outstanding Pediatric Scientist in the training phase (resident or fellow) of their career. Past awardees include Steven Abman, William Benitz, Christine Burren, and Con Yost. Nominees are expected to submit an abstract to WSPR and present their work during the plenary session. (\$1,000; nomination letter and abstract submission required)

The Lowell Glasgow Student Research Award (Abbott): This award is given to the student with the most outstanding abstract submitted to WPSR. Please be aware that a copy of the student's abstract must accompany your nomination letter. Past awardees include Richard Kelly, Ken Liechty, David A Stevenson, and Jeremy Alford. (\$750; abstract submission required; no nomination materials)

The Pediatric Resident Research Award (Abbott): This award is given to the resident-in-training submitting the most outstanding abstract to this year's WSPR meeting. The research may be in any area of pediatrics. Abbott Nutrition Laboratories is sponsoring this award, which includes a generous \$750 honorarium. The student will be asked to present the abstract at a subspecialty session. This award will be presented to the top scoring abstract submitted by a pediatric resident (PL1, PL2, PL3) to WSPR. (\$750; abstract required; no nomination materials).

The Mead-Johnson Travel Awards for residents who submit the highest rated abstract in their respective sessions. (\$500; abstract submission required)

The Abbott Nutrition Subspecialty Awards for students who submit the highest rated abstract in their respective sessions. (\$100; abstract submission required)

NEW BUSINESS

Now that you renewed your membership and paid your dues for 2014, some **new business** is important to share... The WSPR Council has been involved in two activities that are designed to increase participation in our Society. One activity is establishing a Survey Monkey Site that will let us survey the membership on topics of interest and opportunities. Most important, the Google Voting Site will let us vote electronically, the benefit of which should be greater participation in governance. The system provides anonymous voting that is secure. Of course, your approval of electronic voting will be necessary.

The topic of your approval of electronic voting brings me to our other activity; namely, amending the Society's Bylaws. Amending is necessary because the Bylaws are decades out-of-date. For example, the Bylaws do not include electronic voting. Fortunately, the Bylaws have a

provision for amending them. The WSPR Council has proposed to implement the electronic voting mechanism by way of the Google Voting Site. Discussion regarding implementation of this mechanism will be through the Survey Monkey Site. If electronic voting is approved by at least two-thirds of membership, we will next vote to amend the Bylaws to allow direct electronic voting for new member applicants. Please watch for notification to use the Google Voting Site.

On a financial note, for those who attended the Carmel meeting last January, the transition to the new meeting format that is less costly seems to be working well, including the poster sessions. The meeting was a success, and the other societies that co-host the meeting are appreciative of the shortened venue contained at the Sunset Center. We all agree that seeing more students has been an additional positive outcome.
